



**LEBANON / LACLEDE COVID-19  
LOCAL – SIT REP**

**SAFETY MESSAGE:**

1. Maintain social distancing of at least 6ft.
2. Stay-At-Home order issued. Stay home except for essential travel as defined by order, which is available online.
3. DO NOT gather in groups larger than 10 people. Lower numbers are better.
4. Clean surfaces in office areas at least daily (twice would be better) with approved cleaners.
5. WASH YOUR HANDS multiple times a day with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand-sanitizer.
6. Don't touch your face!
7. If your sick stay at home. – Fever 100.4, cough, difficulty breathing, sore throat.
8. New symptoms as of 4-27-2020: chills, shaking, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell.

04-28-2020:

1. Severe storms are possible this afternoon and evening. High winds and large hail are possible.
2. 1 PUI remains due to a person traveling in area.

04-24-2020:

1. Rain possible again this evening and into the weekend.

04-22-2020:

1. Rain on and off today. Storms likely this evening into Thursday.

04-21-2020:

1. Rain beginning tonight into Wednesday and Thursday.
2. Flash flooding possible in some areas of southern Missouri.
3. Additional PPE arrived today for First Responders and will be distributed.

04-20-2020:

1. Temps. in the 60's today. Strong storms possible in the afternoon.
  2. PPE from SEMA should be available later today or tomorrow for LE and Fire.
- 04-16-2020:
1. Cooler temps. again today.
- 04-15-2020:
1. Temps. in the mid-50's today and mostly sunny.
- 04-14-2020:
1. Cooler temps. again today.
  2. FD received an additional 75 gowns yesterday from Justice Furniture.
  3. Lake Regional test site experienced some IT problems yesterday.
- 04-13-2020:
1. Cooler weather is expected for the next couple days. Snow possible in parts of region.
  2. Laclede Health is reporting a slight statewide drop in daily positive cases.
  3. Masks have arrived for the A-Team to distribute as needed.
  4. FD personnel have been instructed to wear a mask on every medical call now. Dr. Richards, our medical director suggested this.
- 04-10-2020:
1. Cooler temps. this morning warming into the mid 50's.
  2. Storms possible over the weekend.
- 04-09-2020:
1. Cooler temps. today, freeze warning overnight.
- 04-08-2020:
1. Warm temps. again today, in the 80's.
  2. Severe storms possible late tonight. Damaging wind, hail, heavy rain possible.
- 04-07-2020:
1. Warm, temps. in the lower 80's.
  2. Warm weather will have people outside being active.
  3. Lake Regional test site is up and running today.
- 04-06-2020:
1. Partly cloudy, temps. in the 70's, slight chance of rain.
  2. Drive-Thru test site conducting warm-up testing today.
  3. Statewide Stay-At-Home order takes effect today.
- 04-02-2020:
1. Warm today. Clouds possible later. Thunderstorms possible late tonight into early morning.
- 04-01-2020:
1. Cloudy today with tempts. reaching into the mid-60's.
- 03-31-2020:
1. Mostly sunny today with some clouds mid-morning. Temps in the low 60's.
  2. Health Dept. reports healthcare providers are "so busy" they will not be reporting negative cases but will of course report positive cases. Surge is contributed to commercial lab testing.
  3. A Stay-at-Home Order HAS NOT BEEN issued for Lebanon or Laclede County at this time.
  4. New COVID-19 City policy approved by Personnel Board effective April 1, 2020.
- 03-30-2020:
1. Warm today with rain returning tonight into Tuesday
  2. People are outside and remaining active as they can
  3. R-3 School district meal delivery buses running late this morning, but all meals will be delivered
  4. Administration and HR working to update leave policies and procedures
- 03-27-2020:
1. Warm, cloudy, maybe storms late tonight
  2. Gov. Parsons has received approval from Federal Gov. for emergency status.
  3. Call volume for FD continues to be low
- 03-26-2020:
1. Warm today record highs possible. Storms later in the evening into early morning possible.
  2. People active outside, visiting parks using green spaces.
  3. HR working on modifications to personnel policies created by new legislation passed by Feds. More to follow.

4. Additional stay at home orders today from within Missouri.
5. Brett Hendrix with SEMA office here in Lebanon, stated he is fielding request from our region for sample stay at home orders. Other Communities considering such action.

03-25-2020:

1. Clouds changing to sunny. Temps in low 60's afternoon.
2. Additional PPE arrived yesterday for LE and Fire
3. Fire responded to structure fire this morning on Murphy. No injuries.
  - a. Electric responded for utilities
  - b. Report of our arson suspect in area. Fire Marshal investigating.

03-24-2020:

1. Rain which could be heavy at times is expected today.
2. Low water crossing flooding is possible.
3. PPE was distributed by Laclede Health to LE and Fire – (3-23-20)

**ACTIONS TAKEN / GENERAL INFORMATION TO DATE:**

04-28-20:

1. Governor Parson released Show-Me Strong Recovery Plan Phase 1 yesterday afternoon. It opens Missouri on a large scale but still requires social distancing and sanitation practices be utilized.
2. New CDC symptoms were released chills, repeated shaking, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, and new loss of taste or smell.

04-24-20:

1. Local businesses Kum & Go at 5 and Jefferson, Harbor Freight, King Cash Saver, Wal-Mart, and Hanna's General Store in Conway advised a positive COVID-19 person recently visited their facilities. Monitoring of employees is on-going at this time. The public has been made area.

04-22-20:

1. The Health Department, OEM, and local churches have created a plan for services to resume in the coming days.
2. LE agencies report a reduction in some calls, but more serious calls types, domestic, violence, and petty thief have increased.
3. Stimulus checks from the Federal Gov. have been received throughout the community this week and last.
4. Conference call with Governors Office yesterday, appears Governor Parsons intends to open Missouri back up slowly beginning May 4. He plans to leave many decisions at the local level such as parks, businesses, etc...

04-21-20:

1. LFD responded to fire on Commercial St. Three units of the storage units on Commercial burnt. No injuries. Fire is suspicious in nature. Fire Marshall is conducting investigation.
2. Lebanon Strong T-Shirts have arrived and are being distributed from City Hall.
3. Received a call from a citizen wanting to burn old clothes. Within the City limits tis is prohibited. The only open burning allowed in the City is yard debris grass, leaves, tree limbs. And this must be burnt in a small pile usually 3'x3'x3' or a burn barrel. The burning of trash is also prohibited.

04-20-20:

1. State, Federal, and local leaders are beginning to work towards reopening of communities and the country.
2. Call volumes for Fire agencies throughout the county continue to be low.

04-16-20:

1. Governor Parson extended Missouri Stay-At-Home Order until May 3, 2020.
2. All recalled KN-95 mask issued by SEMA has been obtained by Lebanon Fire for return. Only a few masks were used prior to recall.
3. Lebanon FD received 150 P-100 filters today for use with SCBA Mask if needed.

04-15-20:

1. Emergency agencies continue to look for PPE. Chief Schneider provided information about Justice Furniture to several departments yesterday for gowns. Some have already reached out to Justice for details.

04-14-20:

1. SEMA recalled 48,000 KN-95 mask which had been distributed to local Fire and LE agencies. I have contacted each agency in Lebanon/Laclede and instructed them not to use these masks and hold into them for pick-up.

04-13-20:

1. Lake Regional test site reports low numbers of testing. Average is approximately 7-10 daily. Zero patients on Saturday 4-11-20. All test results have been negative. They are reporting test numbers to Laclede Health.
2. Fire Department ordered 75 gowns from Justice Furniture. Should arrive any day now.
3. Latest information is now predicting the peak of Missouri cases for April 24.

04-10-20:

1. Code Administration reports some local businesses reopening. Occupancy loads are being provided as needed.
2. School has been suspended for the remaining of the year by Governor Parson.
3. 200 surgical masks arrived today. These will be made available to the Staff as needed or requested.

04-09-20:

1. SEMA has provided additional PPE for LE and Fire. Most of what Laclede County received will go to County Fire Departments this round.
2. Mercy EMS personnel are now wearing PPE on every call and anytime they are out in public.
3. Mike sent Sam to KC and picked up hand-sanitizer from a distillery there. Distribution will take place later today.
4. Code Admin and Fire have completed most of the occupancy load adjustments. If other businesses need a new occupancy posted it will be handled as they call in.

04-08-20:

1. PW-Electric had an isolated power outage at the Knight Street apartments overnight. 10 people affected. Power was quickly restored.
2. Justice Furniture is unable to provide us the mask we had hoped for. The mask they are making for Cox Health is a material provided by Cox. Justice had hoped to make mask out of a material in their warehouse for others including the City, but their legal team advised them not to produce said mask. They can still provide gowns.
3. PW, Fire, and Finance continue to look for PPE from a variety of outlets including the industrial side.
4. Fire responded to two fires yesterday. One was a mattress in an outbuilding, second was a brush pile in a field.

04-07-20:

1. Code Admin and Fire continue to place new occupancy signs on local businesses. A couple have requested an even lower number on their facility.
2. Lake Regional test site is fully operational today. They report seeing 10 people yesterday. The PA on site informed me today the turn-around time on results is 24 hours. Samples are going to the University Hospital in Columbia.
3. Not sure if it is an up-tick or not yet, but LE and Fire are running overdoses more frequently over the past few days.

04-06-20:

1. Statewide Stay-At-Home order enacted by Gov. Parsons takes effect today until April 24, 2020.
2. Code Administration, Fire, and Laclede Health will be working with local businesses to help determine their open or close status over the next few days as needed.
3. Laclede Health receiving multiple calls from retail stores unhappy with Stay-At-Home Order. Most common complaint, the retail store feels they should be considered essential.
4. Several local large box stores are already making changes to their operations and limiting the number of people allowed in the store.
5. Code Administration and Fire are working to provide new occupancy loads to open businesses.
6. Lake Regional Health has established a drive-thru test site at the Wallace Building, 325 Harwood. Information will be available soon; hours of operation, etc... An order for a test from a physician is needed and you must call and make an appointment. Appointments are available every ten minutes. Today they are performing practice testing to ensure their process is going to work and their infrastructure is operational.
7. Fire is placing an order for mask and gowns with Justice Furniture. Details on the order; availability and cost, should be available later today from Justice. Justice is making the items in conjunction with Cox Health. The masks (are not N-95) are intended for our staff as there are recommendations that mask maybe helpful in some situations. The gowns are for Fire and PD if needed. Other gowns are in short supply.

04-02-20:

1. Mercy Forward Triage outside of hospital should be operational Friday 4-3-20.

2. Surrounding communities with positive cases are preparing for a surge which is currently expected in May.
3. City Council meeting tomorrow (4-3-20) night (6:00pm) to consider Stay-at-Home order.
4. FD continues to monitor changing patient care procedures daily.
5. Currently only one City Council meeting scheduled for May 2020.

04-01-20:

1. Lebanon R-3 Schools extended their closure status until April 30, 2020.
2. Some local businesses have extended their closures as well. VF Outlet shared email this morning.
3. Reports of people from areas under stay-at-home orders coming to Lebanon for activities. One such situation reported to Code Administration at a local gym.

03-31-20:

1. New COVID-19 policy approved by Personnel Board, effective 4-1-20.
2. FD call volume still trending low.
3. PD dealing with more theft calls and domestics.

03-30-20:

1. Mercy Hospital is placing an exterior triage/screening area at the entrance to the hospital. Should be operational Friday.
2. Federal Gov. has extended recommended social distancing until April 30.
3. Additional voluntary closures of businesses appearing in town.

03-27-20:

1. Please track all expenses for items due to COVID-19 issues. Funding maybe available later.
2. No other items to report.

03-26-20:

1. PPE needs continue to be addressed for responders.
2. New CDC guidelines suggesting patient care being reviewed by FD.
3. No other items reported.

03-25-20:

1. Parks has closed all public bathrooms and playground areas until April 6, 2020.
2. Finance has setup a project code in INCODE. #398.
3. Civic Center has canceled multiple events (Catching up with this one, way behind I know)
4. Small supply of N-95 mask and simple face mask have been provided to HR for distribution as needed.
5. Laclede Health working on plans for drive-thru testing in Laclede. Still pursuing test kits for this.

03-24-20:

1. City buildings have restricted access to the public.
  - a. Utility payments can be made online, by phone, drive-thru service.
  - b. Access to buildings between City departments is limited.
2. Most city restaurants are delivery, drive-thru service only.
3. Grocery stores
  - a. Some items are being rationed
  - b. Eggs, meats, breads difficult to find
  - c. Paper products – Toilet paper, towels difficult to find
  - d. Cleaning products difficult to get
  - e. Seniors and other risk groups are being allowed to shop during specific times
4. Lebanon Fire Department has modified EMS call responses.
5. Lebanon Police Department operating as normal. Are making plans as necessary for priority calls.
6. Some City employees are working from home.
7. City Council meetings have been modified.
  - a. Available to view by video.
  - b. Only 1 Council meeting scheduled for April 2020
  - c. April 2020 work session has been canceled
8. Public Works has separated utility crews, positioning them at three locations in the City
