Hair Salons / Barber Shops / Nail Salons / Tattoo Shops / Massage Therapist

SOCIAL DISTANCING

Missourians shall abide by the 6-foot distancing rule from other individuals. This does not apply to family members or individuals performing job duties that require contact with other people to perform their work duties.

Enhanced precautions should be taken when work duties require contact with people less than 6 feet apart.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Citizens who feel sick should stay home.
- Continue to practice good hygiene.
- Avoid socializing in groups that do not allow for appropriate physical distancing.
- When in public, maximize physical distancing from others.
- Minimize travel to the extent possible.

Under the Show-Me Strong Recovery Plan – Phase I, social distancing requirements do not apply to individuals performing job duties that require contact with other people closer than a 6-foot distance. To assist in the protection and safety of both the employees and clients, the following is recommended guidance for these establishments:

- Temperature screening of all employees at the beginning of each shift, along with assessment for COVID-19 symptoms, including those in the employee household.
- Services should be provided by appointment only.
- For those establishments that provide walk-in services only; the number of customers in the establishment at any one time should be limited to the number of approved occupancy load for the establishment, and able to maintain a 6-foot distance between individuals waiting.
- Clients should remain in their personal vehicles until their designated appointment time.
- Only the client should attend the appointment unless physical necessity requires assistance (to assist with mobility).
- Employees and clients are encouraged to wear masks.
- Distance between each stylist/barber station should be maintained. A minimum of 6-foot is recommended if possible. Physical barriers may be put in place to assist in the separation of stations. Examples would be: acrylic/plexi shields, plastic sheeting/curtains, etc.
- Remove reading materials in waiting areas to eliminate touch-contamination.
- Minimize blow-drying to decrease air movement.
- Adequate time should be left between each client to ensure cleaning and sanitizing of all contact surfaces.
- Employees must perform hand hygiene (hand washing or hand sanitizer) between interactions of each client.
- Cleaning and sanitizing of all chairs, door handles, floors, restrooms, and any other high-touch surfaces must be performed multiple times throughout each workday. Ensure proper concentration and contact time of sanitizer.
- Encourage contactless and/or non-signature payments. If not possible, payment stations must be sanitized between each client use.

Establishments are encouraged to post your guidelines on your websites, Facebook pages, and in media advertising so your patrons will know what is expected upon arrival.

ENFORCEMENT & EFFECTIVE DATES

The state is working with local health authorities to support the order. Local health authorities and law enforcement maintain the same jurisdiction and authority they have always had. This order is in effect beginning 12:01 AM, Monday, May 4, 2020 until 11:59 PM, Sunday, May 31, 2020.
